Mary experiences an **overflowing joy** when she welcomes the angel: "Rejoice, full of grace, the Lord is with you" (Lk 1:28); and she herself proclaims: "My spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Lk 1:47). But she also knows **fear** and **confusion** when the angel speaks to her and "she was troubled" (Lk 1:29). Experience the **deep anguish** of Simeon's prophecy: "a sword will pierce your soul" (Lk 2:35) and, later, the anguish of the loss of Jesus: "Your father and I have been looking for you in anguish" (Lk 2:48).

However, herway of reacting is not to despair, but **to keep and reflect everything in her heart** (Lk 2:19; 2:51). She is not only the mother, but also the disciple: "those who hear the word of God and keep it" (Lk 8:21), "blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it" (Lk 11:28).

The heart of Mary teaches us **to listen, to welcome, and to persevere,** precisely what we need most in the midst of so many voices, distractions, and hopelessness.

Dear young and not-so-young reader: In troubled times of anxiety and doubt, Mary invites you **to enter her heart**. A heart that does not flee from pain or close itself to joy. A heart that does not understand everything but **trusts without reservation**. It teaches us that faith is not a fleeting emotion, but a deliberate decision to trust, hope, and love.
